Dear Parents, Students, and Staff,

This past week has served as a reminder to all of us that the environment provided in each of our Catholic schools is unique and also a great support to the health and well-being of every child.

First, we had our annual Keene Fire Department inspection with Lieutenant Meghan Manke who was pleased with the upgrades and repairs we have made to our 'seasoned' buildings and with our plan going forward to continue to abide by local ordinances. She noted that we conducted our first fire drill of the year successfully (thank you staff and students!) and how important these drills are for schools.

Then, on Wednesday, we were joined by local first responders including parents who are police officers, firefighters, and emergency medical personnel, as we honored all the heroes, past and present, who serve our community and protect our families. The Knights of Columbus have organized this 9/11 Remembrance Mass in the Parish for four years now, and it was wonderful to have them with us as our students sang patriotic songs, prayed special prayers for first responders and for all those lost in the 2001 terrorist attacks, and cheered for our guests after Fr. Alan offered a special blessing for them.

Additionally, our staff were invited to participate in an active shooter training from the diocesan safety agency, BLUE-U, that will be held online on September 19 from 3:30-4:30 pm. This training is available to every staff member, parent, and volunteer, at no cost. After this training, we will discuss as a two-school community how we can implement safety guidelines more fully or revise any practices we have now that could be improved.

Finally, most of us know of the tragic event connected to the local middle school which has been in the news and on social media. Please be assured that our staff is vigilant about any instances where students are being mistreated or possibly bullied. Hurtful behavior is contradictory to our discipline code and goes against how Jesus taught us to treat one another and cannot be tolerated. This is where the foundation of a Catholic Christian education is such a benefit to youngsters. When each child is recognized and treated as a beautiful creation of God, there is no place for bullying. This is what you want for your children, and what we try to reinforce every day. I urge any parent who is concerned about possible bullying to speak to the teacher or to me as we work to make our schools peaceful and joy-filled for everyone.

One goal that I have for this year is to schedule a cyber safety session for parents, given by the local law enforcement officers who deal with these issues, so that parents can be better equipped to identify dangers and protect their children. Family Faith Formation

The theme of this year's family faith formation program is Christian Prayer, as we follow volume four in the series A Family of Faith. We will be exploring and experiencing various forms of prayer, unpacking the significance of the petitions in the Our Father, drawing closer to our Blessed Mother, and more!

Parents meet monthly to receive teaching, inspiration, and support both for their own faith journey and for guiding their children in lessons at home. There are also opportunities to gather as families in community to live out our faith together.

We encourage all families with children from Kindergarten to middle school to participate in this opportunity to grow and deepen your faith life together. There is always more to learn!

Participation in the program is required for families of children in grades 1-3 or older who are preparing to receive the sacraments of reconciliation (typically, second grade), confirmation and first communion (generally, third grade).

Based on the child development principles of Maria Montessori, CGS is hands-on, contemplative method of religious formation that takes place in a specially prepared space called the atrium. Everything in the atrium is designed to foster exploration and wonder as we work with essential elements of the liturgy and scriptures.

The Good Shepherd calls each of us by name, cares for us, and gives us everything we need. In the atrium we are given the freedom to hear His voice, to get to know Him, and to respond with our whole being.

CGS is an especially beautiful way for children to understand the gift and significance of receiving the sacraments of reconciliation, first communion, and confirmation.

Hot lunches have started! Ordering via Renweb is now available in the Lunch Orders section. Orders are placed in Renweb, then you will be invoiced via FACTS, and payments should then be made promptly via FACTS. Our lunch options this year are:

Tuesday -- Chicken nuggets with mac & cheese -- \$5.00

Wednesday -- Ham/turkey/bologna/veggie sandwich with chips -- \$5.00

All orders for chicken nuggets and sandwiches need to be in Renweb by 3pm the day before. Pizza orders need to be in by 9am on Mondays and Fridays. Kate will be closing the Renweb ordering system at those times. Once the system is closed, you can not order lunch for that day.

Instructions for Lunch Ordering in Renweb

- -Student Information tab on the left side.
- -Click on the "Lunch" tab.
- -It will show "today's date" in the calendar area and you'll see the menu below.
- -Upper right corner, hit the "Create Web Order."
- -If you have more than one child, it will show the order menu for all your children. You will need to order individually per child.
- -Choose what items you want each day.
- -Enter quantity and you will need to scroll all the way to the bottom of the screen. (You will see a Order Items button)
- -Payment for lunches will be **later**. You will be <u>invoiced via FACTS</u>, and payments should then be made via FACTS.
