Dear Parents, Students, and Staff,

Thank you to all the students and families who gave so generously to our special dress down for the victims of Hurricane Helene. We collected \$956 and will be sending every penny to Immaculata Catholic School in Asheville, North Carolina. I heard back from the school, which had plenty of damage from the storm, nevertheless rallied to help others in the area. Here's the article that our own Diocese put in its newsletter yesterday:



St. Joseph Regional School and Our Lady of Mercy Academy in Keene had a special dress down at both our schools on

Friday, and they raised almost \$1,000 for Immaculata Catholic School in Asheville, NC. Immaculata is located in Western North Carolina and has been established as a distribution point for relief supplies. Their drive-thru lines continue providing essential items to families in need. Meanwhile, volunteers restock and sort the outdoor loading station that has been vital to Western North Carolina. The school has been closed due to the Hurricane, and will resume classes on October 16th. After the donation from both Catholic schools in Keene, the leadership at Immaculata was "overwhelmed but grateful" for the support.

We do not personally know the students and families at Immaculata, but we are now connected by our understanding that we always need to help those less fortunate than ourselves. We are helping Immaculata, and they in turn, are helping others in their own community who do not have the basics such as clean water and shelter.

Our Mercy Project students at OLMA did some extra fundraising last Saturday. Led by their teacher, Miss Morgan Howerton, the students ran a car wash for the benefit of Cedarcrest in Keene. They raised over \$500 which will be given to Cedracrest when SJRS and OLMA students visit that school on October 24 at 3:30 pm. Our campus ministry is organizing this as part of October's Respect Life Month and will also run a dress down on October 18 for Cedarcrest as well. These are wonderful ways that neighbors can help neighbors as our students learn that all life is sacred.

I applaud our staff at both schools for how they are helping students understand Catholic social teaching. First, helping Immaculata is about the Option for the Poor and Vulnerable, that we are called to put the needs of others first. Second, helping Cedarcrest is about Life and the Dignity of the Human Person, that all human life must be protected and that every person has God-given value and worth.




